





Questionnaire for Parents/Carers February 2024

To love, serve and learn as Jesus shows us


This survey was sent to all parents and carers. 61 families responded to the survey, representing 73 children. Thank you to everyone who took time to respond – we appreciate the overwhelmingly positive feedback, and any issues raised will feed into school improvement action so that we can ensure that we continue to provide high quality provision for our children and parents/carers.

My child feels safe at this school




97% of parents/carers reported that their children are happy at school and all parents agreed that their children feel safe – these are the first priority for our school as we know that when children feel happy, safe and secure, they will achieve well which is why the first part of our school mission statement is “to love”.

If you have any concerns about your child’s happiness in school, please do not hesitate to speak with school staff who will work with you to resolve any issues.



This school makes sure its pupils are well behaved

Our behaviour policy was significantly updated last year with input from the children through School Council. The children reported a positive impact of the changes made to the school rules and systems for rewards, consequences and reflection.


My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively



89% of responses confirmed that children have not had an issue with bullying or that issues had been dealt with quickly and effectively.

Bullying is an issue that we face head on through our curriculum so that children understand what bullying is and how to respond and ask for help, and if any issues of bullying do arise. For more information, our Anti-Bullying Policy is available on the school website.

The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year



93% of parents/carers felt well informed about what children will be learning throughout the year, with only 4 disagreeing. In September, Parents/carers are invited to a “Meet the Teacher” Open Evening, where information is shared about the learning for the coming year. This information is then sent home, and published on the school website, along with a range of other information:

Class information:

- Full curriculum overview for the year
- Full year overviews for writing and maths
- Guidance for parents: reading and spelling
- Subject overviews for each unit of learning

Whole school information:




Parents/carers also have the opportunity in November and March to talk to teachers about children's learning and to look at their books.


When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with

95% of responses confirmed that no issues needed to be raised, or that they were dealt with.

We place great value in building positive relationships with parents/carers and maintain an open-door policy so that any issues can be dealt with quickly and in partnership.



My child has SEND, and the school gives them the support they need to succeed




For children with SEND, staff meet with parents and carers to discuss progress and targets at least once each term, but often more regularly to ensure that we are meeting children's needs and supporting them to progress and succeed.

"Don't know" responses in this instance are difficult to analyse since this could represent parents/carers who don't know whether their child could have SEND or feel they don't know about provision for their child. If you have concerns about your child's progress or that they could have some additional needs, please discuss your concerns with your child's class teacher or our school SENDCO.


The school has high expectations for my child

93% of parents/carers feel that their children are doing well in their learning and 95% feel well informed about progress.

Year group expectations are published on the school website so that you can see what your child will be learning as they progress through school. Parents/Carers are updated about learning and progress each term, at parents' evening in Autumn and Spring Term and through a written report in the Summer Term.

Children with SEND have an individual support plan which is reviewed regularly with parents/carers so that progress towards personal targets can be monitored targets updated.

If you have any concerns about your child's learning or progress, please do not wait for parents' evening or a SEND review meeting, as the sooner concerns are discussed, the sooner we can provide reassurance or take any action necessary.

95% of parents/carers feel that their children have access to a broad and balanced curriculum, with 5% responding that they do not know.

Our curriculum fully meets the requirements of the National Curriculum and all children are taught all subjects throughout the school.

My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school

95% of parents/carers feel that their children can participate in after school clubs and activities.

Clubs are currently offered on a termly basis for all children from Reception through to Year 6, and we aim to offer a choice of clubs for all age groups.

Each term, and over the year as a whole we ensure that we offer a range of clubs which will appeal to the broadest range of children, but are aware of the cost implications for parents so are subsidising all externally-run clubs to minimise costs. We consult with School Council when planning clubs so that what we offer is representative of what children would enjoy.

Personal development is taught through our RSHE curriculum. Information was shared recently, with a focus on the Relationships Education element of our curriculum, but information about the full RSHE and personal development curriculum is available on our school website. Personal development however, is much wider than the lessons taught, embedded through the wider opportunities given to children to flourish as individuals, such as school council, play leaders, junior safety officers, special friends, sporting opportunities, opportunities to perform and present, enrichment opportunities, links with the parish and wider community, awards and celebrations of achievements both in and out of school.
